Associate Professor of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology and Deputy Director of the Institute at Brown for Environment and Society. He was named by Reuters as one of the World's Most Influential Scientific Minds and his work on invasive species has frequently been covered by the New York Times. His research interests focus on species' responses to climate change, species extinction and species invasions. He has co-edited two books, *Foundations of Biogeography* (University of Chicago Press, 2004) and *Species Invasions: Insights into Ecology, Evolution and Biogeography* (Sinauer Associates, 2005). His most recent research explores how species vary in their vulnerability to changes in climate.



“Saving a Million Species”

Climate change threatens many species with extinction, including those in Florida. Professor Sax will explain the nature of this risk, why traditional conservation strategies are no longer sufficient, and what new, controversial strategies for conserving biological diversity are currently being considered.
